NOTICE OF PRESIDENTIAL NOMINATION PRIMARY ELECTION

To all Township and City Voters

In the County of Lac qui Parle, State of Minnesota.

Notice is Hereby Given, that a Presidential Nomination Primary Election will be held in all Election Precincts in Lac qui Parle County

On Tuesday, the Fifth (5th) day of March, 2024,

at which the polls will be open no later than ten (10) o'clock AM to the hour of eight (8) o'clock PM in the township precincts of

Camp Release, Maxwell, and Riverside;

And from seven (7) o'clock AM to eight (8) o'clock PM in the city precincts of Dawson and Madison.

The following precincts are mail ballot: Cities of Boyd, Bellingham, Louisburg, Marietta and Nassau; Townships of Agassiz, Arena, Augusta, Baxter, Cerro Gordo, Freeland, Garfield, Hamlin, Hantho, Lac qui Parle, Lake Shore, Madison, Manfred, Mehurin, Perry, Providence, Ten Mile Lake, Walter and Yellow Bank.

The voter is choosing a candidate for their party to nominate as the candidate to be placed on the 2024 General Election Ballot.

Presidential nomination primary voters must be registered to vote pursuant to Minnesota Statute 201.054, subd. 1.

Nomination primary voters must also request the ballot of the major political party for whose candidate the individual wishes to vote. Polling place election judges must record in the polling place roster the name of the major political party whose ballot the voter requested. The county auditor must include the name of the major political party whose ballot the voter requested with the voting history of the nomination primary election.

The political party ballot selected by a voter is private data on individuals as defined under section 13.02, subdivision 12, except as provided in section 201.091, subdivision 4a which states Presidential primary political party list. The secretary of state must maintain a list of the voters who voted in a presidential nomination primary and the political party each voter selected. Information maintained on the list is private data on individuals as defined under section 13.02, subdivision 12, except that the secretary of state must provide to the chair of each major political party the list of voters who selected that party.

All persons wishing to cast their vote should appear at their normal precinct polling place during the appropriate voting hours.
